

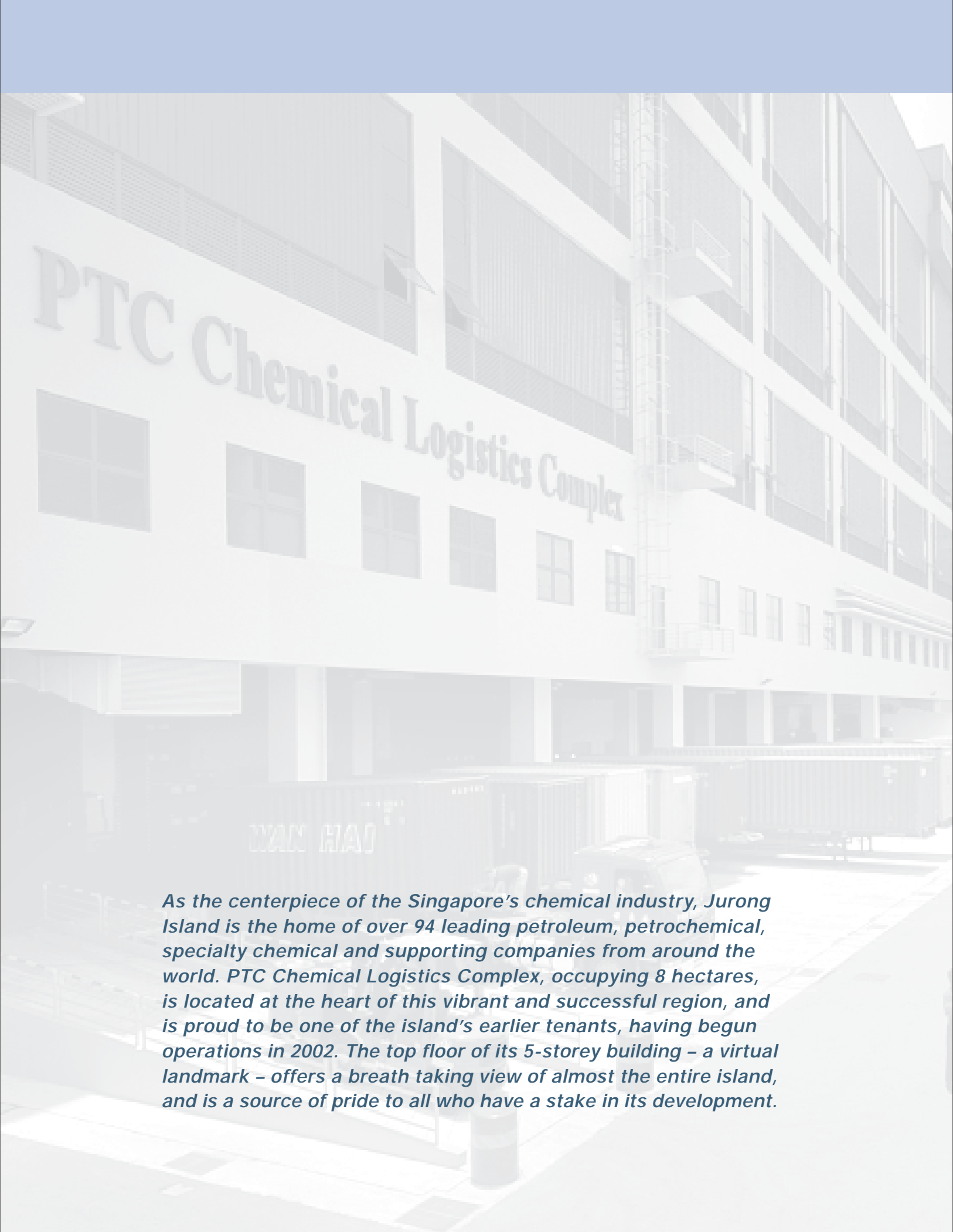

CORPORATE PROFILE

The early beginnings of the group saw the fledgling company operating with just a handful of lorries in the 1950s. Several years later, it expanded into bulk cargo handling and heavy haulage services, later relocating to bigger premises at Pandan Road. By 1999, the Company is an ISO 9000 certified logistics services provider and with revenues of \$43 million, the company listed successfully as Poh Tiong Choon Logistics Limited (PTCL) on the Main Board of the Singapore Stock Exchange.

As one of the first to provide container storage services in Singapore, PTCL also pioneered the very first bulk cargo vessel trimming operations in the republic. It was also ahead of every logistics company in heavy haulage operations, playing a vital part in the early years of Singapore's industrial development. PTCL's business was in the transportation of infrastructural cargo such as turbines, generators and reactors for power, chemical and incineration plants, as well as massive concrete beams for road and bridge construction.

Today, PTCL serves a broad spectrum of industries including the chemical, food, retail, infrastructure and shipping sectors.

The Group's core businesses encompass the following:

- Transportation, bulk cargo handling and stevedoring
- Warehousing, drumming and related services
- Trading
- Leasing & Property Development
- Terminal management

Transportation

With over 50 years experience, the company has a strong track record of transporting high value, sensitive and even chemical cargo in various forms, including conventional, general containers, bulk and bulk liquid containers.

Today PTCL has one of the largest fleets of cargo vehicles in Singapore, numbering 206 prime movers, over 1,470 trailers and other vehicles such as refrigerated trucks, tipper trucks and general usage lorries. With customers ranging from multinationals in the petrochemical industries to individual customers, PTCL believes that no job is too big or too small to undertake efficiently and profitably.

Bulk Cargo Handling and Stevedoring

As one of Singapore's major bulk cargo handlers, the Company loads and discharges from vessels cargoes that include aggregates, bulk cement, sand, salt and other chemical raw materials.

Warehousing, Drumming and Related Services

Drum filling of chemical products, and other warehouse and logistics operations including inventory management, local and international freight management and storage and distribution of loaded containers are all carried out from two warehouse facilities owned and operated by PTCL.

Trading

The Group's traditional trading activities include the regional sale of bitumen in bulk containers, distribution of liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) to households and commercial establishments and the sale of diesel fuel to industries.

Leasing & Property Development

The Group sub-leases a portion of its land in Jurong Island to Stolt Container Terminal Pte Ltd which operates an ISO tank cleaning and repair facility. Because its services complements PTCL, Stolt's operations benefit customers of the Group as together both corporations can offer a one-stop facility for companies that require a comprehensive, integrated and cost effective solution to various logistic demands that include tank heating, cleaning and repair, drum filling, warehousing, and other specialised ancillary services.



In February 2007 PTC Development Pte Ltd successfully tendered for a URA industrial development site, a portion of which was subsequently sold for an encouraging profit. The remaining plot is now being developed into a factory with office space under a construction agreement with a multinational company servicing the Oil & Gas industry. A lease agreement shall be entered upon TOP of the property.

Terminal Management

Through Hai Poh Terminals Pte Ltd, a joint venture with Cougar Logistics Corporation Ltd, PTCL is able to provide terminal management services to its customers. Since 1984, Hai Poh Terminals has operated an appropriated berth in PSA for major multinational liners, specialising in RORO vessel capabilities.

PTC Chemical Logistics Complex at Jurong Island

Strategically located in the centre of Jurong Island, the Chemical Logistics Complex comprises a 5-storey warehouse, a drumming plant for chemicals, storage facilities for dangerous cargo and a high-density automated storage and retrieval system (ASRS). A web-ready management system integrates the entire physical facility and operation, ensuring efficient and accurate identification, tracking and management of cargo. With a height of 39m, the ASRS, designed to support information, space and resource management, has already demonstrated substantial savings in space and labour costs. The system is also expected to act as a platform for further development into e-commerce.

The open yard facility for the storage of loaded containers is dominated by a Rubber-Tyred Gantry Crane equipped with auto-steering features and a Smartrail System based on Global Positioning System technology. The first such system to be installed in Asia, the Crane runs on virtual tracks and is able to stack up to seven containers high and eight wide.

The PTC Chemical Logistics Complex is a one-stop supply chain service hub with the capability to provide the following value-added services:

- Real time inventory management
- Storage of dangerous cargo and non dangerous cargo
- Drumming of non-hazardous chemicals
- Spares management
- Container transshipment hub
- Interface with clients' Enterprise Resource Planning Systems
- Transportation and freight coordination/ documentation services

CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT

In February, our subsidiary, PTC Development Pte Ltd took a maiden step in the property market and successfully tendered for a URA industrial development site, part of which we subsequently sold for an encouraging gain. For the remaining plot of land, the Company entered into an agreement with a multinational company servicing the Oil & Gas industry to build and lease to them a factory building with office space.

Over the course of 2007, we also made some important strategic moves, incorporating two joint ventures, Stolt-PTC Bitubulk Pte Ltd and Wujiang Zhongxin Logistics Consortium Co., Ltd to expand and develop new markets. As economies become more globalised, strategic alliances of this nature will remain important to us as it brings complementary strengths, resulting in new opportunities for growth in markets, sales and value.

We also continued to scale up the capabilities of our global arm. Our 100% owned subsidiary in Shanghai had been awarded a Dangerous Cargo license as well as an international freight handling license during the year. This has opened up new frontiers for our subsidiary, and we look forward to doing more business in China.

Divisional Performance

Revenue from the Transportation & Bulk Cargo Division grew by 31% from \$51 million in 2006 to \$67 million in 2007, and operating profit increased by close to 4 times from \$1.1 million to \$5.3 million. This is due to an increase in sales volume coupled with a marked improvement in profit margins.

ON BEHALF OF THE BOARD, I am pleased to present the Annual Report and Audited Accounts of Poh Tiong Choon Logistics Limited (the Company) and its subsidiaries (the Group) for the financial year ended 31 December 2007.

Group Performance

2007 was an exciting year for the Company and the Group. The group revenue increased to a historic high of \$91 million from \$79 million the previous year. Apart from the trading division which had a 24% drop in revenue, generally all divisions across the Group reported an improvement in revenue.

It is especially gratifying to see that the key segment of our business, the Transportation & Bulk Cargo Division, was the main driver in boosting sales, clinching several new contracts during the year. It has now become well entrenched as a major player in bulk cargo handling operations in Singapore.

The robust growth in revenue had resulted in an increase in the Group's profit before tax from \$3.3 million for year 2006 to \$8.6 million for year 2007.

The Warehousing Division, which includes drumming operations, recorded a constant growth in revenue, rising by 4% from S\$7.8 million in 2006 to \$8.1 million in 2007. However, with higher operating costs, the operating profit increased by only 2% from \$1.88 million to \$1.92 million.

The Trading Division revenue decreased by 24% to \$14 million and this was generally attributed to the scaling down of the grocery distribution business. This has resulted in an operating loss of \$0.24 million compared to an operating profit of \$0.16 million in 2006.

Revenue from the Leasing Division comprises income from the lease of our land to the ISO tank cleaning and repair facility operated by Stolt-Nielsen S.A. Group, the largest tank terminals operator in the world. The revenue and operating profit for this Division is consistent at \$0.6 million and \$0.3 million respectively.

The Terminal Management Division represented by our 50% joint venture in Hai Poh Terminals Pte Ltd contributed a pre-tax profit of \$0.1 million.

Dividend

The Board of Directors has recommended a final dividend of 1.25 cents per share for the financial year ended 31 December 2007. Together with the interim dividend and special dividend of 1.5 cents per share less tax paid in September 2007, the total dividends for the financial year amount to 2.75 cents per ordinary share, as compared to 1.25 cents in 2006. The final dividend

will be paid after approval is given by shareholders at the Annual General Meeting.

Prospects

With the record growth in revenue and net profits, the Group has made a good start to the new financial year. The Group's core business is expected to continue to operate in a highly competitive environment and results will be impacted by the rising oil prices and higher operating costs.

The Group intends to maintain its competitive strength through the strict control of cost increases and the constant search for strategic alliances and synergistic joint ventures to enhance shareholder value.

In Appreciation

For year 2007 I am pleased to note that the management team had worked hard to turn in strong results in the face of difficult operating conditions. On behalf of the Board, I wish to thank my fellow Directors and staff for their contribution, commitment and dedication in their endeavour to deliver quality services. I would also like to thank our business partners for their support and co-operation over the past year, and also our customers for their patronage and for putting their full trust in us. We look forward to continued success in 2008 and beyond.

Lai Kwan Yew, Francis (Senior Manager, Transportation Department)

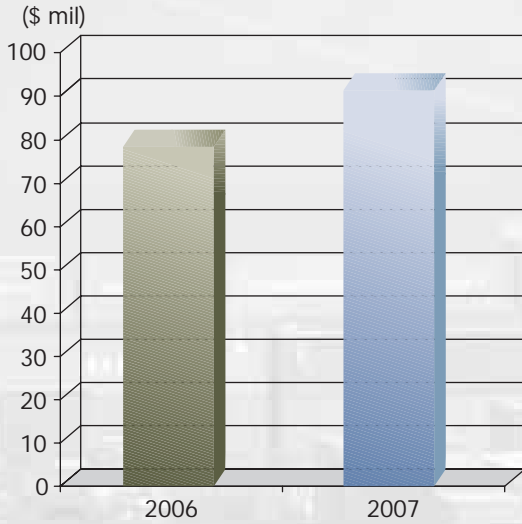
Mr Lai Kwan Yew, Francis, 56, is the Senior Manager of the Transportation Department. He joined the Group in 1995.

Chan Siang Buck, Eric (Senior Manager, Warehouse Department)

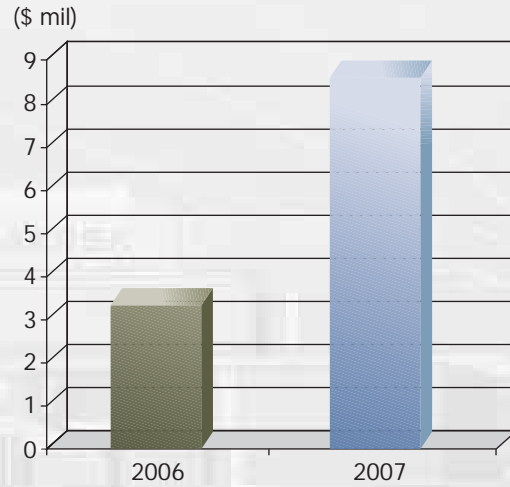

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS



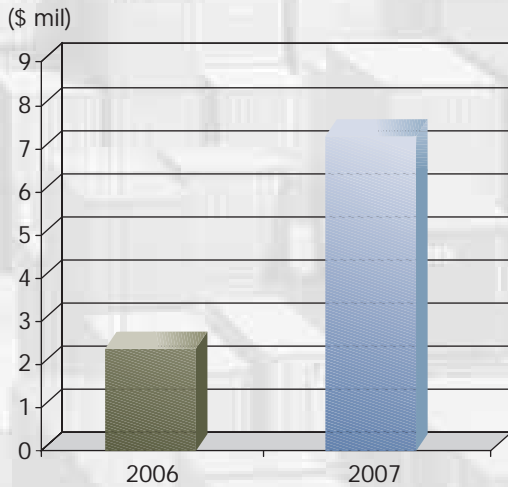
Revenue

Revenue increased by 15% from \$78.9 million in 2006 to \$90.6 million in 2007.



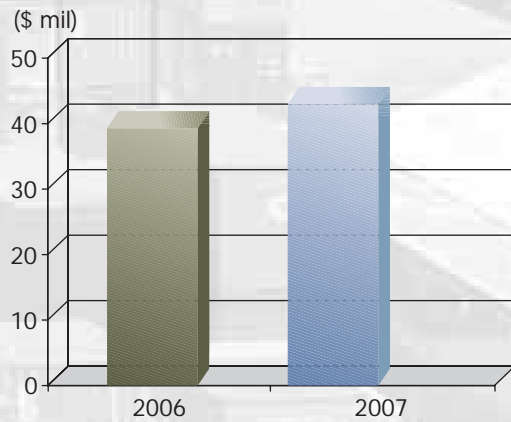
Profit before tax

Profit before tax increased by 161% from \$3.3 million in 2006 to \$8.6 million in 2007.

Profit after tax attributable to shareholders increased by 200% from \$2.4 million in 2006 to \$7.2 million in 2007.



Shareholders' fund

Shareholders' fund increased by 6.8% from \$39.8 million in 2006 to \$42.5 million in 2007.



A portion of the Group's 8 hectare site in Jurong Island is leased to Stolt Container Terminal, which is an ISO tank cleaning and repair facility operated by Stolt-Neilsen S.A. Group, the world's largest tank terminal operator. Because the services of Stolt and PTCL are complementary, customers of both companies benefit substantially from this one-stop facility when they require a wide range of services from tank cleaning to drum filling and warehousing.

TRANSPORTATION & BULK CARGO HANDLING

Despite a rise in operational costs such as diesel fuel and labour, efficiencies gained in recent years are well rewarded in higher yields and this, together with an increase in demand from our customers, has contributed to a remarkably healthy bottom line in the Group's bulk cargo operations. Profits jumped from \$1.1 million to \$5.3 million on the back of a 31% increase in revenue to \$67 million, contributing the bulk of earnings to the Group.

Fleet replacement and expansion continued to increase with over \$7 million spent on the purchase of commercial vehicles and equipments.

In the months ahead, the Group is cautiously optimistic, believing that even as the company is well positioned to take advantage of its reputation for service excellence, the continuing healthy growth of many sectors of the Singapore economy will ensure it of a constant and substantial volume of operation.

Poh Tiong Choon Logistics (Shanghai) Ltd, our 100% subsidiary in Shanghai, had been awarded a Dangerous Cargo license and an international freight handling license in 2007, enabling our company to establish a proper foothold into the vast China market.



WAREHOUSING

The Group's warehousing division, which includes drumming operations, enjoyed a reasonably good year with an increase of 4% in revenue to \$8.13 million and a modest 2% increase in profits to \$1.92 million over 2006. This is mainly due to higher operating expenses.

Operations centre on two warehouse complexes, one in Pandan Road, and the other in the Chemical Logistics Complex at Jurong Island. The latter comprises a well-secured 5-storey facility housing a chemical drumming plant, storage facilities for dangerous cargo and a high-density automated storage and retrieval system (ASRS). Built only 6 years ago, the Jurong Island facilities have enabled the Group to become one of the leading chemical logistics service providers in the region, and have more than demonstrated the Group's successful standing amongst its competitors.



There was a marginal increase in revenue for the warehousing division whilst operating profit rose by just 2% because of higher operating expenses.



TRADING

Revenue from the trading and retail distribution business fell by 24% to \$14 million, due to a drop in consumer demand and increased competition in the supply market.

TERMINAL MANAGEMENT

Hai Poh Terminals Pte Ltd, a 50% joint venture company, operates an appropriated berth at PSA, and provides a full range of terminal services. In 2007, the joint venture contributed a post-tax profit of \$0.1 million to the Group.

LEASING & PROPERTY DEVELOPMENT

The lease of part of our land in Jurong Island to Stolt Container Terminal, an ISO tank cleaning and repair facility, yields an annual income of \$0.63 million, but of greater value to the Group is our combined strengths in the ability to offer a wider range of services 'under one roof' to our customers.

The recent purchase of an industrial development site from URA marked our entry into property development. A portion of this land has since been sold for an encouraging gain, whilst the rest of the land is being developed into a factory cum office building and shall be leased to a multinational company servicing the Oil & Gas industry.
